WHY RECYCLE?

Recycling in Pinellas County is important because it significantly extends the life of the county's landfill, conserves natural resources, and helps achieve a long-term goal of zero waste to landfill. If recycling stopped, the county's only landfill would fill up much faster, leading to increased garbage disposal costs for future generations due to the need to transport waste out of the county.

RECYCLING INFORMATION:

Dunedin recycling hub is at 810 Lake Haven Rd, between Virginia St. and Main St.

NO plastic bags! Fill a container with your glass and plastic and empty it in the recycle bins at the recycle site.

Nothing smaller than your fist. No matter the materials of the product, if something is smaller than your fist, it's too small to be processed at the sorting plant.


Don't rely on the recycling symbol. The recycling symbol is not regulated, so some materials cannot be recycled in Dunedin's program. Make sure to check Dunedin's Recycling Guide.

No tangles: Yard debris, plastic bags, chains, wires, and other contaminants can tangle machinery and slow down the recycling sorting process.

Clean, dry and loose! Ensure all items are clean, dry and loose when placing them into the recycling bin

When in doubt, throw it out! If you're unsure of an item, check the Pinellas county recycle guide at: pinellas.gov.

Still can't find it? No problem, just throw it out. Recycling the wrong materials can cause damage and slowdown of machinery in recycling centers.

PUBLIX will take your old plastic grocery bags and clean Styrofoam take out food containers.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE: Pinellas County holds regular Waste (HHW) collection events, typically on the second and fourth Saturday of each month at HHW North, 29582 U.S. Highway 19 North in Clearwater. You must be a Pinellas County resident to attend, and you should stay in your vehicle while staff collect the items from your trunk, truck bed, or trailer. A list of accepted and non-accepted items can be found on the Pinellas County Solid Waste website.
